

## METHOD OF EVALUATING TRANSLATIONS

A word, a phrase, or a verse will be evaluated at each reading. The instructor will explain the literal Greek. He will write the exact words to be evaluated on the blackboard (no other words will be considered). Only renderings agreed upon by the standard Greek works shall be used.

The message which the inspired writer penned is God's Word, not how we could apply it to us today. Some translations are designed to give us the literal meaning of the Greek words; others the meaning of the Greek thoughts. Both will be rated equally.

One great perversion is certainly worse than many insignificant inadequacies; therefore, the grade system is designed to provide such a perspective.

If several major words or thoughts are involved in the passage, each shall be evaluated separately (on different lines) but at one reading.

The scoring is as follows:

Precisely accurate (word or idea)	5 points
Almost accurate (word or idea)	3 points
Fairly accurate (word or idea)	1 point
Neutral (neither positive nor negative; ambiguous)	0 points
Somewhat inaccurate	-1 point
Quite inaccurate <i>gives part of sense of Gr</i>	-3 points
Very inaccurate (minor consequence)	-5 points
Very inaccurate (medium consequence)	-10 points
Very inaccurate (major consequence; perversion)	-30 points

In-between points may be assigned, as value judgment dictates, for other factors.

Words that reflect accurate teaching but inaccurate renderings because of translating receive a higher score than an inaccurate teaching in first-century thought, but not as high as an accurate rendering, especially if it destroys a type or weakens a truth.

## EXAMPLES:

1. Greek—"...thieves dig through and steal" (rock and clay homes) 5 points
2. "...thieves break through and steal" (modern board homes) 3 points
3. Greek—"...lampstand"  $\theta\acute{\iota}$  5 points
4. "...candlestick" *wax* 1 point

In examples 1 and 2 the method is quite inconsequential, where as in examples 3 and 4 the typology of the oil in the lamp is destroyed, although the essential symbol of light remains.

BLOOD "HAIMA"

Found 99 times in New Testament. Always means blood. Many liberals today are trying to remove all this "bloody business" from the Gospel. Note Heb. 9:22.
