## ASSIGNMENT AND INFORMATION SHEET

## Phase 1: Prayer Assignment

Select a prayer from the Bible. Alternate Old and New Testament prayers, but use only one prayer from the book of Psalms. Research the prayer according to the format given below. Write a paper (averaging three pages in length) in either outline or prose form, addressing each research category. Bring your completed paper to class the following week to exchange it with a different classmate each time. You will do seven prayer assignments total. Any assignment turned in two weeks or more after the due date will not receive credit.

## Phase 2: Prayer Examination

If you have not done your assignment on time, do not take another student's paper to examine. Instead, complete your assignment, turn it in to the College Administration office, and get another student's paper at that time. Read your classmate's paper, checking each category in the assignment. If the paper you are reading is comprehensive for any given category, state why you think that particular category is complete. Include helpful comments and corrections. Examining another student's paper gives both you and the other student different insights into the same passage. It is not acceptable to merely write "complete" for every point. Answer each question as if you were doing the assignment. Write your comments on a separate sheet of paper with your name, and staple it to the back of the paper you have examined, then add your name as "examiner" at the top left-hand corner of the student's assignment. Turn in both papers the next week of class. You will do seven prayer examinations total.
